Dear Neighbor,

To meet the demands of our growing community and comply with state and federal regulations, the following wholesale rate increases were adopted at the North Davis Sewer District's (District) regular Board Meeting held December 12, 2013: effective July 1, 2014 - \$12.50/month; effective July 1, 2015 - \$15.50/month; effective July 1, 2016 - \$18.50/month; and effective July 1, 2017 - \$21.50/month.

The District recently updated its Facility Plan to identify the most critical needs of its sewer lines and treatment plant. The Plan identified an estimated \$167 million in upgrades, expansion, repairs, and rehabilitation needs of the District's facilities. The rate increases will provide funds for addressing these needs. The District's increased rates are still at the middle of the scale when compared across the state.

The District currently serves a population of approximately 200,000 in seven cities and portions of unincorporated areas of Davis and Weber counties. The units that treat the solids contained in sewage were originally constructed in the 1950's and have not been expanded since the early 1980's when the population was only 95,000. The District's sewer pipes are getting older; some have been in continuous service for more than 70 years. Several lines need refurbishing because of their severely deteriorated condition. Also, new lines are needed to provide increased capacity for projected growth through 2035. To address these important treatment and collection needs, projects will be constructed in phases over the next 10+ years. The costs of improvements will be paid for with a combination of bonding and ongoing system revenues.

Although the cities in the District operate and maintain their own small-diameter sewer collection systems, the transporting of sewage in large-diameter trunk lines and processing of sewage at the wastewater treatment plant are provided by the District. Therefore, a large portion of the sewer fee included in your city utility bill is for the operation of these District facilities.
